<b>ATUM</b>	Egyptian - Atenism	Primordial god from whom all else arose. - <b>the First God</b>	- the father/creator of the divine couple, to all kings in the pyramids. - Existed before creation. - was lonely & created children &/or other dieties
<b>PTAH</b>	Egyptian - god of craftsmanship & architects	Brought the world into being with words & creative speech ( <b>artist/creator/designer</b> )	- crafted the world in the design of his heart. - gave life to all the gods - multiple names & titles - the begetter of the first beginning, lord of truth, lord of eternity, one who listens to prayers, master of ceremonies, master of justice, God of all gods, the double being, the beautiful face
<b>GOD the Father</b>	Abrahamic Religions - Judaism, Christianity, Catholicism	The creator of all things & God of all gods - ...IS <b>LOVE</b>	- king of kings, lord of lords, beginning of all things - the one, eternal, omnipotent, omniscient, the creator of the universe.
<b>Allāh</b>	Abrahamic Religion - Islam	<b>"THE God"</b>	- the one & only God - singular & sovereign. - never sleeps or tires, transcendent & perceives everything. - reacts to everything & everywhere through omnipresence and divine knowledge
<b>Waheguru</b>	Sikhism	literally meaning " <b>wow guru</b> ", figuratively translated to mean " <b>Wonderful God</b> " or " <b>Wonderful Lord</b> "	- wonderful or WOW! + guru = Awesome/Wonder full 'teacher, spiritual guide, God'. OR 'Wondrous Lord'. - great instructor who takes away darkness from their pupil & enlightens them. - formless and omnipresent deity. - considered to be ultimate goodness in-which the purified soul merges into whilst evil is vanquished before it.
<b>GOD</b>	Baha'i Faith	<b>"All-Powerful"</b> , or the <b>'All-Loving'</b>	- a single, personal, inaccessible, omniscient, omnipresent, imperishable, and almighty God who is the creator of all things in the universe. - human understanding of God is achieved through his revelations via his Manifestations
<b>Havyi Rabbi</b>	Mandaeism	<b>The Great Life / The Great Living God / The Supreme God</b> from which all things emanate / <b>The First Life</b>	- the belief of the only one great God, (Hayyi Rabbi), to whom all absolute properties belong; - He created all the worlds, formed the soul through his power, & placed it, by means of angels, into the human body. - also He created Adam and Eve, the first man and woman. - Mandeans recognize God to be the eternal, creator of all, the one and only in domination who has no partner.
<b>Vishnu</b>	Hinduism	the pervader', <b>the supreme being , the triple deity of supreme divinity</b>	- also known as Narayana and Hari - the supreme being within Vaishnavism = limitless, transcendent and unchanging, benevolent and fearsome. - Whenever the world is threatened with evil, chaos, & destructive forces, Vishnu descends in the form of an avatar (incarnation) to restore the cosmic order, and protect balance of life.
<b>Unkulunkulu</b>	Zulu Mythology	often formatted as <b>uNkulunkulu</b> , <sup>[1]</sup> - mythical ancestor, mythical predecessor group. <sup>[2]</sup> / <b>Supreme Creator</b> in the language of the Zulu people. / 'first ancestor' figure,	- Unkulunkulu morphed into a creator god figure with the spread of Christianity. <sup>[3]</sup> - general term referring to an "old-old one," or an ancestor. - could be male or female, and most tribes and families had one, regarding them with great respect. <sup>[1]</sup> - ancient figure; as the ancestor of humanity
<b>Tōnacātēcuhtli</b>	Aztec Mythology	<b>creator and fertility god</b>	- worshipped for putting people on the earth and making it fruitful - resided in ("the mansion of the Lord of Abundance"), also known as Omeyocan, the 13th, highest heaven, from which human souls descended to earth
<b>Chiminigagua</b>	Muisca Mythology	the <b>supreme being, omnipotent god and creator of the world</b>	- was a universally good god & represented the only light that existed when it was night time. - When the world was created there was only darkness and the only light was given by Chiminigagua. - When Chiminigagua decided to shine light across the Universe, he first opened his gigantic belly from where light was shining.
<b>Viracocha</b>	Inca Mythology	<b>the great creator deity</b>	- seen as the creator of all things, or the substance from which all things are created, and intimately associated with the sea. <sup>[3]</sup> - created the universe, sun, moon, and stars, time (by commanding the sun to move over the sky) <sup>[4]</sup> and civilization itself. - worshipped as god of the sun and of storms. He was represented as wearing the sun for a crown, with thunderbolts in his hands, and tears descending from his eyes as rain - the 'old god', the maker of time or 'deus faber' (god maker
<b>'Ēl</b>	Canaanite Religion	'Ēl - Northwest Semitic word meaning <b>'god' or 'deity'</b>	- In northwest Semitic use, <b>'Ēl</b> was a generic word for any god as well as the special name or title of a particular god who was distinguished from other gods as being <b>'the god'</b> . <sup>[11]</sup> - 'Ēl is listed at the head of many pantheons. In some Canaanite and Ugaritic sources, 'Ēl played a role as <b>father of the gods, of creation, or both</b> . <sup>[12]</sup>

<b>Sidaba Mapu</b>	Manipuri Mythology - asian context	<b>"Immortal God" / the Supreme God / Creator of the universe / the Sky God</b>	- being that Created the Universe - King of the Gods - Member of Meitei Guardians of the Directions
<b>Esege Malan</b>	Mongolian Mythology	Mongolian: <b>Эсегэ Малан</b> / Buryat: <b>Эсэгэ</b> / Russian: <b>Эсэгэ Малан</b>	- the great Creator of all living things. - sky-god who rules over the western horizon. - His son is Solobung Yubin, a spiritual morning star which, will reward the Mongol people with greater harvest yields and prosperity. - chief of the sky-spirits - In the beginning of Universe there were only Esege Malan, the highest god. Everywhere was dark and silent. There was nothing to be seen. Esege took up a handful of earth and made the sun and moon. Then he made all plants. Esege divided the earth into East and West. Gave it to the highest order of gods
<b>The Kotoamatsukami</b>	Japanese Mythology	the <b>three dieties</b> that first began all things - • Amenominakanushi - <b>Central Master</b> • Takamimusubi - <b>High Creator</b> Kamimusubi - <b>Divine Creator</b>	Kotoamatsukami - collective name for the first gods which came into existence at the time of the creation of the universe. - born without any procreation. - the Japanese creation myth (天地開闢, Tenchi-kaibyaku, literally "creation of heaven and earth") is the story that describes the legendary birth of the celestial and creative world, the birth of the first gods, and the birth of the Japanese archipelago. - dieties, known as Kotoamatsukami, appeared spontaneously, did not have a definite sex, did not have partners (hitorigami) and went into hiding after their emergence.
<b>Shangdi</b>	Chinese Mythology	<b>Emperor , Supreme Deity, Highest Deity</b>	- deriving from Shang theology and finding an equivalent in the later Tian ("Heaven" or "Great Whole") of Zhou theology.[1] - also meaning of "Primordial Deity" or "First Deity" in Classical Chinese.
<b>Thần Trụ Trời</b>	Vietnamese Mythology	or Ông Trụ Trời / Khổng Lồ	He was the first god, the one who created the world by separating sky & earth by building a pillar to support sky. - *a giant god, extremely tall, indescribably long legs. Every step he takes is ice from one area to another, from one mountain to another." - After the god Thần Trụ Trời divided heaven and earth, there were other gods who continued the work of building this world.
<b>Búri</b>	Norse Mythology	The 'Giant' GrandFather of Odin	- is a divinity god 'producer, father' of all other gods.[1] and an early ancestor of the Æsir gods of the principal pantheon in Norse religion - he had a son, Borr, by way of an unknown process
<b>Rod</b>	Slavic Mythology	also known as <b>Sud</b> ("the Judge"), perhaps as the supreme god.	- the god of the family, ancestors and fate, perhaps as the supreme god. - derived from the Proto-Slavic word 'rods, meaning "family", "birth", "origin", "clan", but also "yield", "harvest", and this word is in turn derived from the Proto-Indo-European root *wreh₂ds "root". - Rod's Holiday was celebrated on December 23.
<b>Radien-attje</b>	Sámi mythology	Jubmel, Waralden Olmai, Maylmen Olmai, Vearalden Olmai or Waralden Olmai - is <b>the superior or celestial deity</b>	The superior deity is the ruler of the <b>Cosmos</b> . - The superior deity is also the <b>"giver of life"</b> and is considered the god of fertility. - Radien-attje is often portrayed as the <b>main figure in a Trinity</b> , which besides him, consists of the Raedieahkka or Radien-akka (the superior mother) and their son Radien-pardne
<b>Makemake</b>	Rapa Nui mythology	<b>Make-Make / the Creating God / the source of all things</b>	- the creator of humanity, the god of fertility and the chief god of the "Tangata manu" or bird-man sect - Make-Make, after creating the Earth, felt lonely and thought that something was missing. - created children (bird-sect & Man) - Finally, he fertilized the red clay earth and from it made a man. But the man was lonely, so he made him fall asleep and from his rib created the woman.
<b>Ranginui</b>	Māori mythology	<b>Rangi / Raki / Rakinui.[2]</b> meaning "Sky" or "Good Sky"	- in the beginning, there was Te Kore (The Nothing; Void) which became Te Korematua (The Parentless Void) in its search for procreation.[8] From it came Te Pō (The Night), becoming Te Pōroa (The Long Night), and then becoming Te Pōnui (The Great Night). Gradually Te Ao (The Light) glimmered into existence, stretching to all corners of the universe to become Te Aotūroa (The Long-Standing Light).[9] - Next came Te Ata (The Dawn), from which came Te Mākū (The Moisture), and Mahoranuiatea (Cloud of the Dawn). Te Mākū and Mahoranuiatea wed to form <b>Rangi</b> . [10]:56
